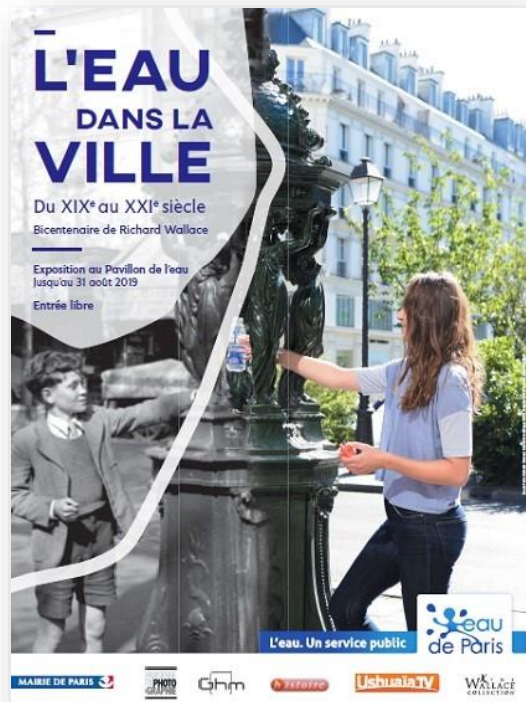

In conjunction with the bicentenary of the birth of Sir Richard Wallace, the British philanthropist who offered the city its famous Wallace fountains, Eau de Paris presents an exhibition at the Pavillon de l'eau. Through an unprecedented collection of vintage photographs, short films and period objects, the exhibition invites the visitor to learn about the fascinating history of the Parisian hydraulic system, which was born 150 years ago and continues to deliver drinking water every day to the 3 million users. Sir Richard Wallace and his iconic fountains are featured. The exhibition is open to all. An educational booklet is available for the youngest visitors.
